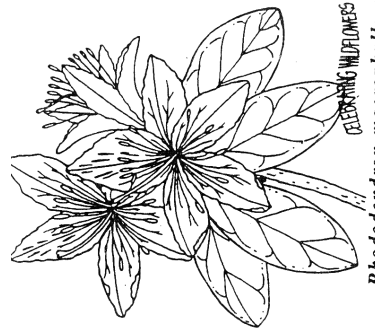


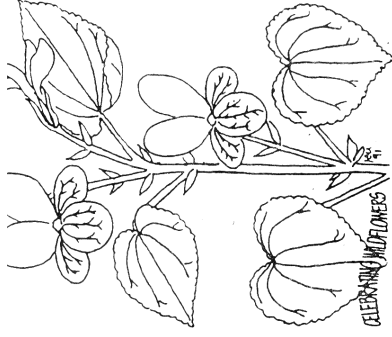
## Five Types of Flowers

Please use this sheet as a guide to finding the 5 types of wildflowers as illustrated and explained. Note similarities and differences, sizes, colors, etc. Look carefully! See how many of each type you can find.



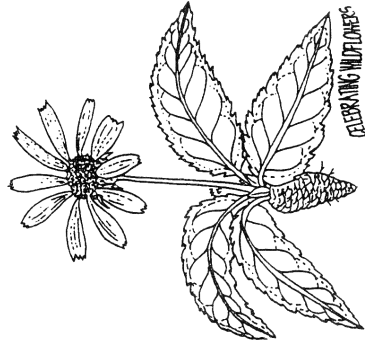
*Rhododendron macrophyllum*  
Pacific Rhododendron

1. "simple flower"; flower parts are easily observable- sepals, petals, stamens, pistil(s). Nectar and pollen are readily accessible; no particular pollinator is favored.



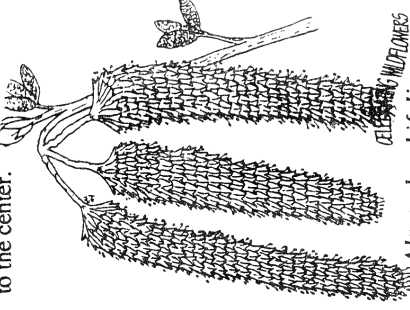
*Viola glabella*

2. "bee flowers"; Johnny Jump Up the petals of these flowers have a definite top and bottom which often serves as a landing pad; they also often have markings to guide insects to the center.

Serrated-Leaved Balsamroot

3. "composite flowers"; every "flower" is really a bouquet or head of tiny tubular flowers surrounded by longer rays that are unfolded to form rays. Composites are well suited for butterflies.



*Alnus rhombifolia*  
White Alder

5. "wind-pollinated flowers"; these flowers generally lack petals, they don't need them! Flowers are commonly small and numerous.
